As a special membership incentive, instructors who register at least 15 student members in one technical program plus one or more professionals by **Nov. 15** will receive a free SkillsUSA resource. If you register 50 or more members than you had last year by Nov. 15, your chapter will receive two SkillsUSA Framework podium banners.

National membership dues for professional members are \$20 plus state dues, which vary.
