>>> SkillsUSA Celebrates Our Biggest National Signing Day Ever

SkillsUSA National Signing Day on May 7 was the largest in SkillsUSA history, with 3,039 students in 202 schools! That's more than double last year's numbers! Why the growth? Because word is spreading: There's never been a better time to be skilled. At Signing Day, students publicly signed letters of intent to pursue career paths in the skilled trades while parents, teachers, partners and more cheered them on. The boundless pride of the day was evident in the glowing faces of the attendees. >>> Sparks Memorial Scholarship for NLSC — Apply by May 17

The Sparks Memorial Scholarship has been established to help SkillsUSA state gold medalists attend the 2024 NLSC in Atlanta. There are five scholarships being awarded at \$250 per scholarship. Any high school or college/postsecondary state champion in the Criminal Justice, Crime Scene Investigation, Emergency Medical Technician or Firefighting competitions may apply. The scholarship funds will be paid to the student's school or school district to help pay for registration and other costs (unless designated by the school to be dispersed differently). This scholarship is for an individual student, and each member of a team (CSI or EMT) may apply. The application deadline is **Friday, May 17**.
